You are a vital part of serving these individuals. Your ongoing dedication as a donor to programs that change lives have made our work possible. We wanted you to be the first to hear this news!



To mark this special occasion we're sending you this special edition of our *Visions* newsletter that highlights some of the different regions we serve and how your help is making a difference right in your own backyard.


